Populations in transition: Population density is very low in much of the area of northern China crossed by the Great Wall.
- 2** Elderly woman in central Asia.
Populations in transition: Demographic ageing is a worldwide phenomenon.
- 3** Homelessness in Paris.

Patterns in environmental quality and sustainability: Climate change may mean that such defences will have to be improved sooner than originally anticipated.

Patterns in environmental quality and sustainability: Lakes are an important element of water resources in some countries.
- 9** National Park Centre – the Yorkshire Dales, UK.
Patterns in environmental quality and sustainability: National Parks and other protected areas are a vital element in the movement for a more sustainable planet.
- 10** Solar panels on a house in Turkey.
Patterns in resource consumption: Some countries have more potential for using solar energy than others.
- 11** Chimney smoke from domestic fires in Ulaanbaatar.
Patterns in resource consumption: Heavy domestic use of coal can create severe winter smogs in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia.
